PE & Sports Grant (PE&SG) Sports Premium

Hathaway has received a PE and Sports grant of 9265 and we have used it in the following ways:

- To develop whole school approach to PE and the impact this can have on other subjects and school life
- To encourage children to participate in a wider range of clubs and activities across the school
- To encourage children to take a leadership role within the school

Featherstone School Sports Partnership (SSP) core level agreement provides Hathaway with:

- CPD training for staff
- Mentoring for PE Coordinator
- Access to resources provided by the Youths Sports Trust (YST)
- P.E lead training
- Train and mentor children to become sports leaders

CPD training has been given in whole school inset days, whereby staff were able to understand the FUNs resources and develop their delivery of P.E. lessons. Through this training PE has made cross curricular links to other subjects such as maths ,literacy and science. It has also made an impact on attainment and behaviour.

Featherstone has also provided for Hathaway pupils involvement in the wider organisation of sports in our school. We have had a group of 15 children who are part of the organising crew and 12 children who take on active roles as Sports Leaders through out the school years. We have previously nominated two children form each year group to become PE Monitors.

The sports leaders and organising crew have been delivering a change 4 life club every day at lunch time encouraging children to be more active, teaching them new games that they can play and pass on to others thus building their social skills and self eseeem. 35% of students are involved in the wider organisation on P.E

Overall Impact

There has been an increase in the number of clubs being run throughout the year within the school. Children are more active and focused during break times. Also there is more involvement of K.S.1. Staff a more supportive of PE within the school and see the link between this and whole school development.

Overall impact is a raise in leadership of 17% and 46% in extra curriculum clubs.
