To the Rescue

History

- Learn the story of Grace Darling
- Talk about differences between then and now, learning and practising everyday historical terms
- Understand the background of sea rescue and keeping safe at sea
- Create a role-play area of a modern lifeboat station
- Use ICT to support their learning e.g. the Grace Darling animated story, RNLI website
- Discuss charitable work of RNLI

English

- Learn some poems and rhymes about the sea
- Make up some poems of their own
- Write lists, logs etc as required for the role play area
- Listen to stories and join in with songs about lighthouses, rescues and the sea
- Learn relevant vocabulary and language e.g. making and taking calls to emergency services
- Use various forms of writing to prepare for their 'art exhibition'

Music

- Vocal work, including warm-up activities
- Learning new songs

Applied Mathematics

- Doubling and halving
- Ordering numbers
- Simple multiplication and division
- Make models with 2D and 3D shapes

Computing
