
What are we learning in the Autumn term?







During our English lessons the children will explore high quality picture books which allows them to put themselves inside the story and empathise with characters and their issues and dilemmas

The children will be encouraged to engage with illustrations throughout the picture books and will explore and recognise the added layers of meaning these can give to our interpretation of a text

They will explore themes and issues, and develop and sustain ideas through discussion, enabling them to make connections with their own live

The children will be given opportunities to develop creative responses to the text through drama, poetry, storytelling and artwork and will be encouraged to write in role in order to explore and develop empathy for characters

In Science we will be learning all about..

Animals including Humans

- We will identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals
- Identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores
- Describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals (fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals including pets)
- Identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each senses.

that live in Kenya. We will also be using globes, maps and atlases to locate Kenya within Africa and the world. Throughout this topic the children will be encouraged to


understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of
