
We have been making repeating patterns, learning to count to 10 and recognise some of our numbers.

During PE we have been learning different ball skills. They have all been practising balL control and passing the ball.




This term we have been learning about road safety and how we should cross roads safely. the children have enjoyed putting into practise what they have learnt in our very own road in the playground.



Year 3 visited The Natural History Museum as part of our Science topic on 'Rocks'. We had a talk from a lady in role as Mary Anning. She told us about her life as a palaeontologist- a fossil hunter. We helped her to classify fossils and we had lots of questions for her because in literacy our current text is 'Stone Girl, Bone Girl- the life of Mary Anning'. We also took a class photo with one of Mary Anning's greatest fossil find in the



Next, we went to the volcano and earthquake gallery in the red zone, which linked to our geography topic 'What makes the Earth angry?'. We went inside a shop and experienced what an earthquake would feel and look like when the shop started shaking. For our angry earth day, we will be doing a science experiment to see how to make our volcanoes that we made in DT erupt using bicarbonate soda and vinegar!



On 12th December, we visited the Hindu temple called the Mandir. We learnt about how Hindus worship and looked at some of the features inside the temple. This linked to our RE learning on Hinduism. We enjoy learning about other religions because we are showing tolerance and respect for other people's beliefs.

They explained different items around the church and why they are important to Christians. We got to light the Advent wreath and try on their special clothes.

For out DT projects we had a go at weaving with plastic bags to create mats or purses, just like the women in our book. We had to make a loom out of card and string, then cut the bags into strips we could weave with.


