Changes in School

What will my child be learning?

To help our children transition back to school following the Lockdown, we are teaching a 'Recovery Curriculum' alongside the National Curriculum.

This recovery curriculum is being followed by schools in Ealing and others across the country. Please see more information below:

THE 5 LEVERS OF RECOVERY

LEVER 1: RELATIONSHIPS

We will not necessarily expect our children to return joyfully. Many of the relationships that were thriving, such as with friends, teachers, supporting adults may need to be invested in and restored. We will plan for this to happen, not assume that it will.

LEVER 2: COMMUNITY

We will recognise that your child's curriculum will have been based at home for a long time. We will listen to what has happened in this time, understand the needs of our community and engage them in the transitioning of learning back into school.

LEVER 3: TRANSPARENT CURRICULUM

Our children may well feel they have lost time with their learning at school and we want to show them that we understand this and that we will help them to become confident learners at school.

LEVER 4: METACOGNITION

In different environments, children will have been learning in different ways and may have developed different styles of learning. It is vital that we acknowledge this.

LEVER 5: SPACE - TO BE, TO REDISCOVER SELF, AND TO FIND THEIR VOICE ON LEARNING IN THIS ISSUE

It is only natural that we all work at an incredible pace to make sure this group of learners are not disadvantaged against their peers, providing opportunity and exploration alongside the intensity of our expectations.

Phonics

Letters and Sounds

<u>Phase 2</u>

In Phase 2, letters and their sounds are introduced one at a time. A set of letters is taught each week, in the following sequence: Set 1: s, a, t, p

Set 1: s, d, i, p Set 2: i, n, m, d Set 3: g, o, c, k Set 4: ck, e, u, r Set 5: h, b, f, ff, l, ll, ss

<u>Phase 3</u>

In phase 3, 25 new graphemes are introduced one at a time. Sets of letters and sounds are taught each week.

Set 6: j, v, w, x Set 7: y, z, zz, qu Consonant digraphs: ch, sh, th, ng Vowel digraphs: ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi, ear, air, ure, er They will also be introduced to tricky words that can't be decoded.

-Phase 4

In phase 4 no new graphemes are introduced. The aim of this phase is consolidate the children's knowledge and to help them learn to read and spell words which have adjacent consonants such as:

trap, string, and milk.

More tricky words will introduced.

<u>Home Learning</u>

All homework will be set online on a Friday and due in by the next Thursday. We have a range of fantastic online learning tools which are crucial in helping children improve their learning.

Any incomplete/late homework will result in a Red and loss of Dojo points.

Our focus for home learning is:



- **Reading skills** Due to the current circumstances we will <u>not be</u> <u>sending books home</u>. <u>We are asking for books to not be brought</u> <u>in to school</u> in order to limit the amount of items being brought into the building.
- We will be sending home a login and password to our Bug Club, which enables you to read E-books with the children at home.
- Books will be added regularly once the children have read what has been allocated to them.
- As their phonics knowledge grows the books get harder to support their reading.
- Books will be added regularly.
- Bug Club is a fantastic tool where teachers can set books matched to your child's reading ability. Children receive instant feedback and teachers are able to see where support is needed.



Google Classroom

Digital skills through other curriculum areas - these are equally as important as reading, writing & maths skills. In today's world, nearly all jobs have some sort of computing element. Computing is a part of the National Curriculum for all pupils. At Woodlands, we want our children to be confident when using technology so that they are able to access the same opportunities as other children around the world.

Watch this space for more information on Google Classroom! We will start teaching the children about this in school too.

In the case of another lockdown or school closure, children will continue their learning through these very same online platforms. We are teaching children how to use these resources at school.

How can I help my child at home?

Reading: Your child should read and be read to everyday at home. It's great for their language and imagination.

Everyone enjoys a snuggle and a book.

Here are a few more ideas to help support your child's learning:

Sing and tell nursery rhymes. Talk about the numbers, colours, words and letters you see when you are out and about.



Explore the park at different times of the year. Allow your child to cut out and stick pictures from magazines.

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<u>Useful Information</u>

BAGS

- Please can you provide a bag with spare clothes which can be left at school for your child in case the need to be changed.
- Please can all uniforms and spare clothes be labelled clearly with your child's full name.

Cooking

- In Reception we would usually do cooking weekly but due to the current situation this has been postponed until further notice.
- When it reassumes we ask parents for a donation of £5 to contribute towards the cost of ingredients.

Other

- No sweets or chocolates to celebrate birthdays please.
- Send your child to school with a healthy lunchbox, as we are now a SUGARSMART school.
- Party invitations should be handed out outside of class.
- No ball games or use of play equipment before or after school.
- Absence should be recorded in writing and handed to the office.
- Please ensure you inform the teacher/ office if someone different will be collecting your child at the end of the day.

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I contact my class teacher?

You can contact me using the class email address – <u>reception@woodlands.ealing.sch.uk</u>. I will aim to get back to you within 48 working hours. If it is urgent then you can contact the office at <u>office@woodlands.ealing.sch.uk</u> or speak to me on the gate at the end of the day.

Where can my child find their home learning?

They will need to use their USO Google login to access Google Classroom. This is the same login that was sent home with all children during lockdown. Weekly home learning will be set there.
