We have been pleased that so many of our pupils settled quickly back into their life at school despite all the uncertainty that we are all having to live with as a result of the Covid19 pandemic. They could not have achieved this without the support that you give them at home. The parents' meetings with teachers this term were very well attended either in person, virtually or on the phone. We are pleased that you had the opportunity to come in to school to learn about how your children are doing. We also thank you for completing the short questionnaire to tell us what you think about the school and what you want to learn more about.

We would like to take this opportunity to put on record our thanks to all the staff at Woodlands Academy. This term has been really challenging for everybody involved in helping our pupils adjust to their new classes and the familiar behaviours for learning expected of them after the disruption of the past eighteen months. This term we went on a leaf hunt, looking at how the leaves were changing colour and we talked about why they were falling off the trees. We also noticed how many of the leaves were different shapes and made different patterns when we printed with them. We read the story 'Leaf Man' and then used the leaves to make our leaf character pictures.

During our topic 'Once Upon a Time' we have been reading traditional tales.

We began by making and eating delicious porridge and retold the story Goldilocks and the 3 Bears. We built palaces and castles for the princes and princesses in our stories.

Then, one morning a mysterious egg appeared in the Nursery. We looked at it carefully and talked about who we thought had laid the egg. When we came to school, we checked our egg every day and one morning we found a baby dragon had hatched.



We have also been learning about celebrations with our mini topic, 'Sparkle and Shine'. We learned about how Diwali is celebrated and made divas. We talked about when we see fireworks and how to keep safe on Bonfire Night and Diwali.

We learned about food that is eaten on special occasions and tried some for ourselves. Our favourite was mince pies!

We worked as a team to decorate our Christmas tree using sparkly and shiny ornaments.

We learnt about the celebration of Diwali and read the story of Rama and Sita. The children enjoyed dressing up in the festive clothes and creating their own rangoli patterns. We also learnt a Diwali dance together and the children had a fun time dancing along to some special music. We created fireworks in art and the children learnt about firework safety through our topics of Diwali and Bonfire Night.



Our literacy topic this term was fairytales and traditional tales. We explored; Cinderella, The Three Little Pigs, The Three Billy Goats Gruff, Little Red Riding Hood and Goldilocks and the Three Bears. The children were able to recall their favourite tales and were even able to repeat memorable refrains from certain stories. We engage in many activities related to our topic, such as: creating bridges, building Cinderella's castles, and making the three little bear's hut. The children enjoyed role playing the stories and recreating the key events using their own narratives. We even staged



In maths we have been learning about: circles and triangles, prepositional language, comparing and composing numbers 1 to 5 and looking at one more and one less. We cross linked our circles and triangles topic to art and created amazing artwork inspired by Kadinsky's art. We explored numbers 1 to 5 in depth and have widened our knowledge and understanding of it. We enjoyed exploring various mathematical concepts in both our indoor and outdoor provisions.

For our poetry party, the children were busy helping the adults to make fruit salad, which we then shared along with other delicious foods and drinks. We enjoyed sitting together and sharing our food, whilst accompanied by nursery rhymes to sing along to. Everyone was excited to visit our new library and we all had a great time, dressing up for some photos inside our new library.



We have been busy mark making this term. The children have worked hard to refine their pencil grips and control allowing them to create masterpieces. We have been focusing on letter formations, number formations and name writing.





























English

Yeat 1 have explored story writing this term, looking closely at the story 'The Tiger that came for Tea' and 'Dogger'. They enjoyed using role play and drama to express the characters' thoughts and feelings. They have also written their own versions of the stories.





At the end of our unit on 'The who came to Tea, we had a tea party where we made sandwiches, party hats and tiger masks. In the afternoon we enjoyed eating our party food and playing party games. All our costumes looked amazing, it was great to see so much effort being made.









We have been learning about 'What do Christians believe?'. As part of our learning we visited St Stephens Church, Ealing. We found out about the meaning of the cross, different colours used, the advent wreath and why churches have lots of pictures telling stories.









Our topic this term for science has been 'Animals including humans.' We have done lots of experiments. First we went animal spotting, we found lots of types of birds and even spotted a fox! We then learnt about different types of animals, animal diets and how to look after a pet. We had a very special visitor to help us with this, Ted the tortoise!



In Maths lessons children used cubes, counters and animals to learn different ways to sort and group objects.



They have then been introduced to ordering numbers and different methods of counting and adding. The children used cubes to learn the part whole method. They were learning to add and think of numbers to make a total.







We have been discovering 'All about Me' where we explored family trees and who is in our family. We learnt about how things were different when our parents and grandparents were our age and how things have changed.

We have also been learning about the history of toys. We were able to sort toys from the past from toys from now.



We have been thinking about what makes us special and how we are all important and unique. Come check out our display to find out more about us!




Here are some excellent reasons along with our Fantastic Finish, and home projects!

Design Technology



We made Neolothic shelters in Design Technology lessons. We followed the 4 stages- Research, Plan, Make and Evaluate.

We visited Gunnersbury Park Museum for our first trip in a long time. We did a workshop called 'Surviving The Stone Age'. We did lots of activities including handling and discussing primary sources of evidence (artefacts from The Stone Age), working in groups to make shelters and hunting by throwing spears. We had a great time and we think we have the skills to Survive the Stone Age! The main things you need to survive is food and shelter and we proved that we were pretty good at doing that!









We dressed up like hunter gatherers in the Stone Age for our fantastic finish. We used codes to do some Stone Age counting in maths and did a quiz in teams to show our knowledge of the Stone Age. Take a look at our wonderful home made costumes and the Salt dough necklaces we made and painted.















Year 3 have been learning about animals including humans and had a fantastic time collaboratively making their own skeletons out of paper straws. We learnt there are 206 bones in a grown adult and they help us move, protect our muscles and organs and give us support.

















For our **WOW start** we did lots of different activities to learn about The Romans. First we looked at roman numerals and tried to crack codes with our knowledge. Then we made dice with Roman numerals on them and played dice games.

We then looked at the food the Romans ate and wrote out our menus. We then had our very own Roman feast with lots of foods that the Romans ate and brought to Britain.









The Romans

In November, we went on a school trip to Gunnersbury Park Museum. We did a workshop on the Romans. In the workshop we had the opportunity to dress up as influential people from the Roman times such as Julius Caesar and Boudicca.

We then looked at amazing artefacts such as papyrus and vases.















We also had our class assembly this term. The assembly was about the Roman invasion of Britain. Some of the class were dressed as ruthless Romans and the others as furious Britains. Everyone in Sparrows class worked incredibly hard to learn their lines and to design their amazing costumes.


