From The Chair Of Governors

Welcome

We would like to welcome all our new families who have joined Woodlands Academy this term and welcome back all our other families who have been working with us in previous academic years. We would also like to welcome our new Executive Headteacher, Nathan Walters who will be joining the Grand Union Multi Academy Trust (GUMAT) as Executive Head and Headteacher of Featherstone High School at the start of the Spring Term in January. Mr Gerry Wadwa, our current Executive Head will be retiring at the end of this term after 14 years as Head of Featherstone High School. We wish him and his family all the very best for the future.

The Governing Board

Our responsibilities are to work in partnership with the Trustees of the GUMAT to:

- ensure clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction for Woodlands Academy
- holding executive leaders to account for the educational performance of Woodlands Academy and its pupils and the effective and efficient performance management of staff
- overseeing the financial performance of Woodlands Academy and making sure its money is well spent
- to exercise the strategic oversight of all aspects of safeguarding

This term we have met twice as a Full Board to fulfil our statutory duties and receive reports from each of the committees. We have ratified many school policies including Safeguarding and Child Protection, Behaviour, Complaints, Online Safety, Social Media, and School Uniform. We have also received and agreed the Sports Premium Report, the Pupil Premium and Catch- Up Strategy Report and the SEND Information Report. All these can be found on the school website.

We have 3 committees which the Governing Board has delegated authority to for certain aspects of our responsibilities:

- Resources Committee: responsible for monitoring finance aspects, staffing, premises and Health and Safety
- Curriculum Committee: responsible for monitoring pupil outcomes, quality of teaching and learning and the broad and balance curriculum that we offer all our pupils at Woodlands.
 - Pay Committee: Responsible for monitoring the implementation of the appraisal policy fo all staff to ensure that it is fair and effective; monitoring the implementation the pay policy for staff and carrying out the annual review of performance pay for staff.

In Resources this term we have focussed on monitoring the budget and taking action to mitigate the impact of the energy price rises and the national pay awards for teachers and support staff which were higher than originally planned for. Both the internal and external audit reports have been positive and the recommendations from the Health and Safety Audit, carried out in the Summer Term by the Local Authority, are being addressed. Safeguarding visits have continued.

In Curriculum Committee, we met twice this term and we have received the detailed outcomes for pupils at the end of the Summer Term in both statutory year groups (SATs) and non-statutory year groups. We have also looked at the implementation of the new phonics scheme "Essential Letters and Sounds" in early years and key stage 1 and how we can support our pupils who have English as an additional Language (EAL)

In Pay Committee, we conducted our Annual review of Pay for Performance and the effectiveness of the appraisal system in October. We noted that the national agreements for teacher and support staff pay were higher than originally planned but we have implemented them in full.

We would like to thank you for all the support you give the school and hope that many of you enjoy the coffee mornings and school events that we have thankfully been able to hold in school again this term. Thank you also for encouraging your children to take part in our clubs, choir, educational visits and their home learning. We really value what you can bring to our community. I would also like to thank all the staff for their fantastic commitment to the school and the outcomes for our pupils. It has been a difficult year in terms of absence with so many viruses and bugs going round school and they have suffered as well. Catching up after absence for pupils is vital and I know they have worked extremely hard to ensure that our children have not fallen behind. We wish them, their families, you and your families a happy, healthy and restful festive break.

Year 5 took part in a six week programme with Brentford football club looking at the joy of movement and the importance of being health and physical exercise.






Forest School

We made new friends and learned how to play together.




We learned about how people celebrate Diwali and made salt dough divas.

We pretended to go on holiday to the campsite!






We enjoyed our first school trip to the church where we received a very warm welcome and made our own star puppets










In Maths, we have been learning about numbers to 5 and counting using 5 frames as well as shapes.








We celebrated Black History

Year 1

We have focused in Maths on knowing our numbers to 10 and using part whole model and 10 frame to solve addition and subtraction problems within 10. We have used lots of objects to understand what each number represents.














We have been very busy in English. We started off the term looking at the book 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' by Judith Kerr. The children wrote and designed their own invitations and then wrote their own version of the story. We ended the unit by having a Tiger Tea party. We followed instructions on making jam sandwiches and then got to eat them and play party games. It was lots of fun!









This half term we have read the book 'Sharing a Shell' and looked at non-fiction texts such as fact files. We wrote our own fact file all about hermit crabs.





Year 1 continued...



In Science we have been learning about animals including humans. We found out about different animal groups and sorted them into groups. We also sorted animals into groups by their diet and learnt the terms carnivore, herbivore and omnivore. We discovered most of us were omnivores.





We then investigated our senses. We went on a sound hunt around the school. We heard lots of interesting sounds. We also tested our sense of smell to see if we could smell better when we couldn't see what it was or if we could.



This term in History we thought about our families and the words past, present and future and what they mean. In Geography we looked at maps of our school and even drew our own.





In Art we drew self portraits. We then looked at some portraits by Pablo Picasso and drew our own self portraits in the same style. Can you tell who is who?



In RE we found out more about Christianity and what Christians believe about God. This half term we have found out more about Islam. The children have enjoyed sharing their beliefs and finding out more about what their friends believe in.

Year 2





In Computing we have been learning about what a computer is and its different parts. We role played being digital recorders, shoppers and cashiers to understand the role of computers in a supermarket.



In PE, we have loved playing domes and dishes, pirates and sailors and are great at ball rolling skills!



In Science, we have been investigating materials and their properties. We know materials can be hard, soft, rigid, flexible, absorbent and waterproof. We also know that materials can change shaped if they can be twisted, squashed and bent. Our scientists have tested wood, metal, plastic, paper and fabric to find out our properties.

Year 2 continued...



At the beginning of the year, our focus in Science was 'Plants". We worked in groups to explore different types of plants and their parts We also did a water transportation experiment.



Year 3 continued...
