We also did our class assembly on 'The Seven Summits', the highest mountains on each continent.












In Science, we did an experiment using household items to show how the digestive system works!










Year 5

They also took part in a Victorian lesson which focused on the 3Rs - Reading, Writing and Arithmetic. The children had to write with chalk and misbehaved!






In Autumn 1, our Science topic was Space and Earth. The children used balls and torches to demonstrate how day and night works.








# Year 5 continued...






This term saw the launch of 2 book clubs for children in Y4-6.
