Who are we?

We are a team of Wellbeing Practitioners, **Assistant Educational Psychologists and** LDAPs partnered with primary schools across the borough of Ealing. Our service is designed to support the wellbeing of children and young people in schools as well as school staff themselves. We provide a whole school approach to delivering mental health support at the first signs of difficulty to prevent future problems and promote overall emotional and mental wellbeing.

The new Assistant Educational Psychologists have joined the team and offer a whole school approach to emotional wellbeing and mental health.

What do we do?

We work directly with parents offering two one-to-one tailored support programmes in primary schools: one for anxiety/worries and one for behaviours that challenge. We also organise workshops and groups throughout the year on various topics.

Who can we support?

We work in collaboration with parents or carers of primary school children who sometimes feel anxious (e.g. experience scared or upset feelings, worrying, panic, worries about social situations, or specific fears/phobias) or children showing behaviours that challenge (e.g. difficulties in relationships, difficulties following routines, emotional dysregulation).

We also work with children with learning disabilities and/or autism and their families and school staff.
