Dear Parents/Carers.

Please note that if your child's attendance was below 90% this year, we will be continuing to monitor their attendance closely in September unless there is a significant improvement.

From The Chair Of Governors

This term we have been very concerned that pupil absence has reached almost 10%. We have 61 children who are now classed as persistent absentees. We have seen the impact of this on pupil's learning. There is a direct link between attendance and pupils achieving age related expectations and this will be evident in your child's end of year report. We cannot continue at this level of absence and the school team and governors are working closely with the Local Authority to follow up persistent absence. We recognise that there are family emergencies and childhood illnesses that cannot be avoided, but we are asking for your support in ensuring that your child is in school whenever they are well enough to attend so that they do not miss out on learning key skills and knowledge which will impact on their ability to fulfil their potential in the future.

Our pupils and staff have had a very busy term with lots of learning opportunities in school and out on school trips. The recent trip to Perivale Nature Reserve, for example, enabled pupils to put the skills they had learnt in Maths, Science and Geography to good use.

I was delighted to see so many parents from Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 at the "Read and Relax" morning to experience how our children are taught to read through the phonics scheme "Essential Letters and Sounds" and how this is then progressed through our "Reading to Learn" approach as they get older. I am pleased to tell you that the school will be offering you many opportunities to share in your children's learning in the new academic year.

I also had the absolute pleasure to attend the Year 6 Leavers Production of Kitty Whittington and I was so impressed with the team effort that produced such wonderful singing and acting and entertainment. The pupils obviously enjoyed the opportunity to share this with their parents.

As Governors we have also been busy preparing the budget for the next three years, visiting the school to monitor that our teaching and learning policies are having a positive impact on progress and attainment across the curriculum, checking our safeguarding procedures are well understood by staff and pupils and that the health and safety policy is being adhered to.

We would like to thank you all for your support throughout the year and look forward to welcoming you and your children back to school on Wednesday 6th September promptly at 8.30am.

At the end of Summer 1, some of the classes performed dances that they had learned in their PE lessons in front of the whole school.






















We had a fantastic Sports Day this year. There was a great turn out from family and friends. All the children enjoyed a variety of activities and won lots of stickers!




Our topic in Summer 2 was 'On the Beach'.






We learned about animals that live in rock pools and made clay shell prints.





Reception

In Summer 1, our topic was 'Animal Safari.' We learnt about the animals that live around the world, how to look after animals and the importance of caring for our local and global environments.



















We have continued to do so well in our Phonics and try our best to become confident readers. We can spot harder to read and spell words in many books!

We had a fun filled day of Pirate adventures....






We have had such an amazing year in Reception. Here are some of our best moments.....









Year 1

In year 1 we have read the books The Bear and Meerkat Mail. We had a go at writing our own poems using similes, wrote postcards and instructions.

We had lots of fun making ice cream then writing instructions on how to make it.











This term in Maths we started our focus on multiplication and division using our knowledge of counting in 2s, 5's and 10's. We looked at sharing and fractions, recognising money and knowing the value of each coin and note, and telling the time to o'clock and half past.











In History we looked at polar explorers. We found out about the race to be first to the south pole and Scott of Antarctica. We has learned about Preet Chandi and her incredible solo trek across Antarctica last year. We learned what equipment they took and how that has changed over the last 100 years. We thought about which piece of equipment was the most important to take.

We then learned about Matthew Henson and his fascinating life story, how he beat all the odds to become the first known person to reach the North Pole.

In science we have been learning about plants. We planted a sunflower seed, we were really surprised how quickly they grew!

Then we looked at the parts of a plant and what their function is. We enjoyed making a collage of a flower and adding the labels.

We went on a plant hunt around school to see which flowers we could find and identify. We also looked at the different types of trees that grow at school. We learnt how we can identify different trees by their leaves. We also sorted leaves into groups and spoke about why we grouped them that way.









In Geography we have been exploring the weather and climate. We looked at the different weather types and thought about which we get here in the UK and which are more common in other parts of the world. We monitored the weather and completed a chart to show the temperature that week. We found out that there different cloud types and they can help tell us what type of weather will happen that day.

In RE we have been answering the questions 'What makes a place sacred' and 'How and why do we celebrate sacred times'. The class have enjoyed sharing their own experiences of sacred places and celebrating.

Year 2

We have had and amazing term. All of our hard work and excellent learning has been celebrated everyday. We love learning and we are resilient, confident pupils. Ask us about our recent Maths learning of 2D and 3D shapes; which way is left, right, clockwise and anticlockwise; different religions we learn about; comparing Kenya and the UK and so much more!




When we are happy, our nervous fire and connect, making learning stick. Look at what we think our neurons look like when they FIRE!


We have a 'calm system' It activates when we know we are having a 'helpful response' such as asking for help or breathing.
