# From The Chair Of Governors

#### Governors' update

We would like to thank all our parents and carers for supporting us in increasing our pupils attendance at school and reducing the instances of lateness. Good attendance and punctuality will really help your children reach age related expectations because they are not trying to catch up on the learning they have missed as well as keep up in class. We have seen an improvement this term despite all the illnesses that have been going around affecting our children and staff and we hope that this will continue into the New Year.

Governors have been busy this term looking at our school data in comparison to other local schools and devising a five- year strategy to further develop our school. We hosted leadership teams from two local schools to conduct a peer review of our teaching of reasoning and problem solving in maths and whether the banded books were matched to reading skills of the pupil. They reported on what was working well and areas for us to consider strengthening our practice still further.

We want all our pupils to feel safe and secure in school and we commissioned an external audit of our safeguarding procedures to identify any aspects where we could improve. The auditor was very impressed with our approach to safeguarding and gave us some useful suggestions on what we could build on to be even stronger.

Governors have visited this term to look at safeguarding, behaviour, provision for SEND and Pupil Premium children. We spent time talking to staff and pupils to monitor how are policies were being put into practice. Our children were so enthusiastic to tell us about their learning and how much they enjoyed school.

We would like to thank all our staff for everything they do to nurture our pupils and help them reach their potential and to thank all our parents and carers for the support you give the school and for getting involved in our showcase events to help you support your children's learning at home.

We met our new friends and enjoyed exploring the Nursery.


We Looked and listened for signs of Autumn. We investigated pumpkins!

In Autumn 2, our topics were 'Once Upon A Time' and 'Sparkle and Shine' where we learnt about celebrations that take place during this time of year.


We learnt about the celebration of **Diwali**. We made delicious chapatis and also practiced some traditional dancing...


We've enjoyed being **builders** & measuring our creations.





We have been learning about traditional tales. Some children from Year 6 came in to read us our favourite stories...
















We have had a really busy Autumn term. It has been wonderful getting to know all the children.





## Year 1














In Science our topic was Animals including humans. We identified animals and sorted them into groups. We labeled parts of the human body and tested our senses.

## Year 2 continued...




In PE, we have practised our aim with ball rolling skills and our body balance. Look at out posture. Can you throw and catch different sized objects?






We have also become good historians and written all about the Great Fire of London.

In Year 3 we absolutely love Science and we take every opportunity to show it. Here is some fantastic work we have been doing throughout the term.


In Autumn 1, we conducted a water transport experiment and we found out that the stem transports the water to the other parts of the plant.
