


















Science

Geography



Blitz Workshop - in **November**, we once again demonstrated what great **critical thinkers** we are when Karen and Freya visited from the **Museum of London**.




Science














Parent News



Safeguarding Spotlight

Over the Christmas Holidays

Dear Parents/Carera,

Any time away from school can be difficult for children and families for several reasons:

- being away from their friends and key adults in school (support network)
- falling out of daily routines (including sleep)
- being online and on devices more
- financial pressures on parents of being at home- e.g food and bills

The school holidays is often a time for families to visit relatives/ friends and get out and about.. Please ensure that children are supervised in the house (not left alone or with a minor) and when out in public, particularly in local parks, which can be more risky due to the presence of older pupils/ adults. When near roads, please keep children with you at all times and remind them about being safe on scooters and bikes.

With more free time, children are likely to be using devices more and may even receive electronic gifts. Please ensure that you are aware of the safeguarding issues posed by these electronic devices. We ask for you to ensure that you monitor what children are watching online (content), who they are communicating with (contact), how they are behaving towards others online (conduct) and their access to online marketing/ads (commercialism). Remember, many games have in app purchases, so please check that your child is not clicking this, even by accident. Please remind them that what they do online leaves a digital footprint and it is their responsibility to be sensible when online. It is important for children not to share personal information because people may not be who they say they are. E.g people use gaming chat rooms as a place to talk to and groom children they do not know in real life or pretending to be someone else. Please report anything you are not comfortable with using the reporting tools.

If your child is concerned about anything they see or experience online, please encourage them to talk to you or fill in the Worry Button form (available through Google Classroom).

With devices, please look into setting up parental controls and discussing with your child about the 4cs.

Reminder of The 4 Cs on Online Safety



Are you accessing age appropriate information?



Are you behaving responsibly towards others



Do you know who you are talking to online?



Top tips:

- Try to stick to a bedtime routine close to that during school time.
- Monitor what your child is doing online
- Talk to your child about their feelings
- Do not leave children unattended at home or in public
