

School Holidays

Please be aware of the following advice:

- Children should be supervised by an adult in the local area. Remember it is more likely that there will be older children in the parks in the holidays. Any incidents in local area should be reported to the police. Please report any incidents close to school directly by emailing: pitshanger@met.police.uk
- Babies, toddlers and very young children should never be left alone. There are many risks of leaving a child unaccompanied as they don't have the maturity to deal with emergency situations. It is illegal to leave a child under the age of 16 years old alone overnight.
- Children's online activity on devices should be monitored. Children should always be aware of the risks of speaking to people online and should never share anything inappropriate online, including comments and images. Recently in the news, there have been alarming reports of gangs using criminal exploitation to blackmail young people about images that they have shared.
