We improved attendance this year, but still have a long way to go to reach our pre-pandemic levels and we will continue to work on this next year. We will also be looking further at punctuality as we have noticed an increase in the number of children arriving at school through the office, after the gate has closed.

Having read through the newsletter, I am pleased to see the fantastic range of activities, trips, clubs and events which we have been able to hold this year. The staff really have gone above and beyond to ensure that our community receive every possible opportunity we can offer and I thank them all for their continued commitment to our school community.

In May we were visited by Ofsted. While we would not have chosen to have this experience at the same time as the Year 6 SATS, the whole school worked together to ensure that we showcased the school at its best. I have never been so proud to be the Headteacher of Woodlands as I was during those 2 days, watching our staff support each other to ensure every question was answered, seeing our children celebrating their learning and listening to our parents recognising the value of our school community. In the final report, Ofsted said we are 'a happy and nurturing school'. To me, this summarises our community in one phrase.

After a very busy year, it is now time to enjoy a well deserved rest. I wish all of you a very happy and relaxing summer break. We look forward to welcoming everyone back on Wednesday 4th September (Nursery and Reception start times may vary).

From The Chair Of Governors

Well Done!

We would like to say well done to all our pupils for their achievements this year. These are many and varied and we are very proud of the progress pupils have made towards their goals. Sporting achievements, attendance awards, applying the school values and music events and productions are all to be celebrated. In the SATs, in EYFS, Year 1, Year 4 and Year 6 we were really pleased that we got very close to the targets we had set. In EYFS, 65% of our pupils achieved a Good Level of Development. In phonics screening 80% of those who were able to access the assessment passed. In the multiplication tests in Year 4, 38% of our children got 25 out of 25 compared to 25% nationally. In Year 6, 74% of our pupils reached Age Related Expectation (ARE) in Reading, 71% reached ARE in Maths, 65% reached ARE in Spelling and Grammar and 55% reached ARE in Writing and 74% reached ARE in Science.

We would also like to say well done to everyone in the school community for supporting the school through the recent Ofsted Inspection. We are delighted that the inspectors recognised the strengths of our school, and we also value the clarity they gave us in what we needed to focus on to do even better.

5 Year Strategy

The Governing Body is responsible for setting the vision, values and strategic direction of the school. We have worked together with staff and some parents to develop a 5- year strategy which reflects our expectations and longer-term development plans. This has been




Year 3-5 took part in a mixed **Athletics** event...








Daily Mile





Music News

Musician of the Year 2023 -2024 Adrian Sherin







Firstly, huge congratulations to Adrian Sherin in Year 6 who recently took his Grade 5 Saxophone exam and passed with Merit. Since joining the school, Adrian has been heavily involved in the music at Woodlands and I'm sure I speak for all staff in saying that we will miss his Saxophone playing, Piano playing and involvement in the Choir. Given Adrian's commitment to music over the past year, I have awarded him Woodlands Musician of the Year 2023-24.

Following on from above, I would like to extend my thanks to many other children in Year 6 who have given time and commitment to music whilst at Woodlands. I hope you have enjoyed all of the opportunities you have had and I do hope you continue to get involved in music at your next schools!

Year 5 - Learning the Saxophone

Both myself and our specialist tutor Mr Mckay have been very impressed with Year 5 this term. Mr Mckay writes:

"This years class know how to hold the J-Sax with the left hand at the top. Their single reed embouchure is developing, with all pupils managing a consistent sound. Most pupils can play B A G E D & C. Breath control, the ability to play phrases and sustained notes is developed and they have also learned how to read music."

Some students have made particularly impressive progress on the instrument and as part of Woodlands commitment to nurture and develop musical talent, some students will be offered the opportunity to continue learning in Year 6. Mr Jones will be in touch in September regarding this.

Year 4 - Learning the Recorder

Both myself and Mr Russell have been teaching Year 4 to play the recorder. This is a great introduction to playing a musical instrument and gives a solid foundation to learning the Saxophone next year.

Children can actually start learning the recorder even as young as Year 1. We have a club at school which children can join - but even using youtube and buying a recorder can be a great start to learning the basics!

Congratulations to these children who have shown a big improvement in their writing this term. Keep it up!






Handwriting Awards
