





Year 1

This term in Maths we have been learning multiplication and division with 2, 5 and 10 times table, fractions learning about whole, halves and quarters of shapes and numbers; money learning about value and recognising coins and notes; an time, learning to tell time to o'clock and half past and understanding calendars and how long a minute is. In English we read Tyrannosaurus drip and Meerkat Mail. We wrote postcards, instructions and stories.







In Science we have been learning all about plants. We made collages of flowers and labelled the different parts. We planted sunflower seeds and observed them growing. We also went on a hunt round the school looking at plants and trees and using charts to identify them.







In History we looked at polar explorers, find out about the amazing journeys people have taken to the South Pole and North Pole. We learned about Captains Scott's race to the South Pole and Preet Chaandi becoming the first woman of colour to cross Antarctica in a solo expedition. We also found out about Matthew Henson who was the first man to reach the North Pole.

In Geography we have been learning about seasons and weather. We know the UK has 4 seasons, Spring, Summer, Autumn and winter. We looked at different types of weather and thought about which season we usually experience them in and also which types of weather we usually experience in the UK. We had lots of fun making our own weather station and keeping a weather diary. We then became weather forecasters and presented our own weather reports.













In Geography we have been learning about physical and human features. We have been identifying the various kinds of human and physical features in Kenya.


Role play and drama activities are an intrinsic part of our English lessons.

Year 3 continued...








In Year 3 our love for Science is strong due to our curious personalities. We always have questions about everything and why things are the way they are.

In Spring 1, for our topic 'Plants' we conducted a science investigation when we were growing our own bean plant. We were able to predict and observe over time, whether seeds germinate in soil, sand, paper or just water.



For our 'Light' topic in summer 2, we conducted an experiment and investigated which objects can be seen in the dark. We were quite surprised by the results, as lots of us were able to see different items. Check out how proud we were sharing our results.









Year 4

In English this term we have been writing a balanced argument and our book, "The Paper Bag Prince" was also the springboard for some drama activities.

We have been improving our oracy skills by holding debates on a range of topics, from river pollution to whether children should be allowed to vote in general elections.







The Summer Term is a very busy time for Maths. Sparrows Class has worked very hard to expand their knowledge of time, money and shape in addition to more work on fractions and decimals.











Our final History topic of the year was the Vikings and this provided the inspiration for making a typical Viking soup in our DT lessons.

In Geography this term we have been continuing our learning about rivers by planning and conducting a field trip to the River Brent to measure the speed of the river at different points.




In Science we have been learning about classifying living things. We were able to make good use of the Woodlands Forest School to search for invertebrates to classify.


In Music, Sparrows Class has really enjoyed learning to play the recorder!








We have many talented artists in Sparrows class and this term we have been working on our painting skills and learning to tint and shade our colours to create a 3D effect.






















June: We visited Pizza Express, where we learnt about food hygiene before making our own pizza. We enjoyed eating them back in school!








June: TFL workshop - we were given some top tips for keeping safe as we become more independent travellers.




Dear families,
