

Hummingbirds class adores **Science**! Throughout Spring term we have been extremely busy **predicting**, **observing** and **conducting** experiments. Take a look at our work.




In Spring 1, for our topic Rocks and Fossils, we worked in groups and identified the different types of rocks and their properties.




It's been another fun term for practical discovery in Science, where we have been learning about both electricity and sound. We have constructed simple circuits and have also found out how sound travels to our ears.










Year 4 continued...

Problem solving with rectilinear shapes in Maths



On a lovely spring day on April 1st, Year 4 headed into town to take part in a workshop about Roman Britain at the London Amphitheatre under the Guildhall Art Gallery. The children were able to build on their learning about the Romans in the previous term and a great time was had by all!

Year 5 Kingfishers had a fantastic term filled with exciting learning opportunities and hands-on experiences. We began with a fascinating visit to Ealing Library, where we learned all about the history of Pitshanger High Street. The children enjoyed looking at old photographs and maps, and they discovered how the local area had changed over time.







As part of our geography fieldwork, we walked to Pitshanger High Street to carry out a survey. The children asked local residents why they visited the high street, helping them answer their enquiry question about what makes a high street successful. The children showed excellent teamwork and communication skills while collecting their data.












We took part in an important talk on rail safety. This included a virtual session where the children learned how to stay safe near train lines and stations. They discussed the dangers of trespassing and how to act responsibly around railways. It was a valuable reminder about making safe choices.

In *Design and Technology*, Kingfishers explored the topic of *structures and bridges*. After learning about different types of bridges, the children built their own *truss bridges using spaghetti!* They tested the strength of their bridges and made improvements along the way. It was a brilliant opportunity to apply their knowledge of materials and engineering in a fun and creative way.










In *Science*, the children investigated *soluble* and *insoluble* materials. They planned and carried out fair tests to see which substances dissolved in water and which did not. The children worked carefully, recorded their results, and drew thoughtful conclusions from their findings.







We also had fun with our *dancing raisins* investigation! The children placed raisins into fizzy water and observed them closely. They noticed that the bubbles attached to the surface of the raisins caused them to rise and fall, as if they were dancing.
























We took part in a virtual **Rail Safety workshop**, which reminded us about how to keep safe.


Class Dojo winners


Handwriting Awards
