Storytelling Workshops

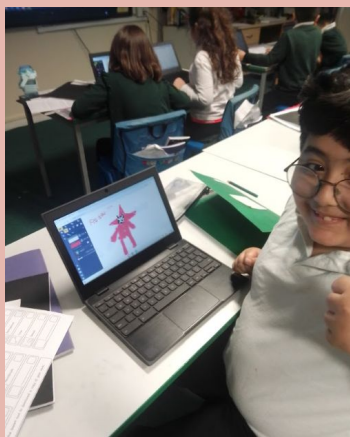
We participated in a series of workshops with master storyteller Jordan Campbell this term, which the children all thoroughly enjoyed.



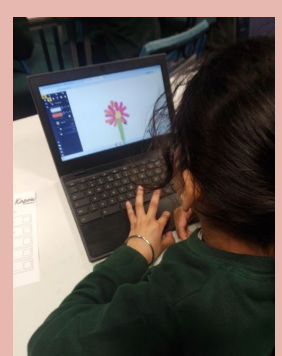
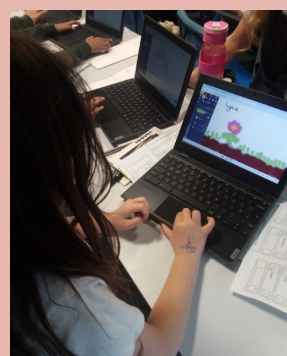
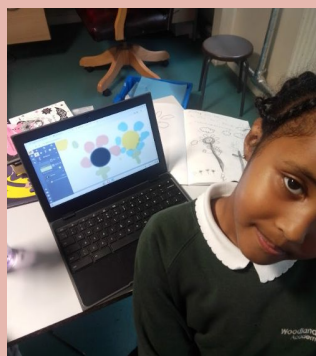

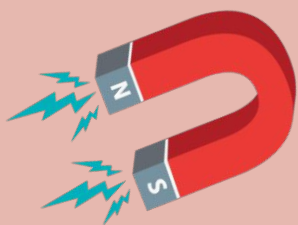
We have been learning plenty of new skills in **PE** this term, including enjoying dodgeball, hockey and tennis.

Its was all about the Anglo Saxons! We were loud, clear and full of information about the Anglo Saxons.



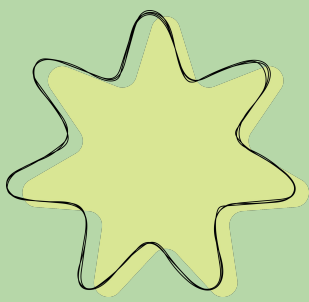
Our History Topic was all about who Anglo Saxon were, where they came from and who their famous leaders were.

Penny, the historical actress shared interesting facts and stories about Benjamin Franklin, such as his air bath!



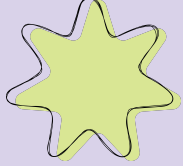

Safety during the holidays

- Please help to keep your children safe when they are using devices at home by following the 4Cs, which they have learnt about at school.
- If there is anything worrying your child online, please encourage them to tell you, take screenshots, block users if necessary and report it to the platform. Visit NSPCC for more information- <https://www.nspcc.org.uk/keeping-children-safe/online-safety/>
- **If you ever have concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child**, concerns can also be reported directly to ECIRS, which coordinates support from social care, health and police services to ensure children receive help quickly when needed. **Call- 020 8825 8000 or if a child is in immediate danger, report it to the police by calling 999.**
- **Please remember to ensure children are supervised at home and in public during the holidays.**
- Below is an important message we shared with children in our end of term assembly, reminding them about how to keep themselves safe while they are away from school. **Please discuss these messages with your children.**

REMEMBER:

1. Tell an adult if you are worried about anything online.
2. Be kind to others online. We can still monitor your school login activity. Take screenshot evidence of any inappropriate/ bullying behaviour then report the user and block them.
3. Keep your personal information private. E.g do not share photos or videos of yourself or anyone else. You never know who is watching!
