

*Hard working*Year 3 *Hummingbirds*

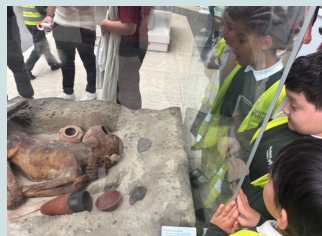
We kicked off the summer term with a fantastic experience day at Featherstone High School. We took part in Dance and Art lessons and had a great taster of what high school is like.

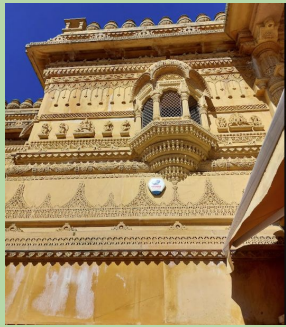

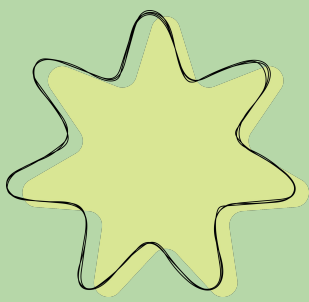

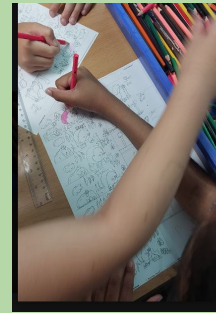




Year 4 continued...

We took in donations.

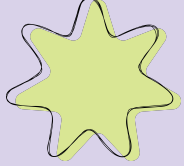


We organised and ran a teachers' car wash!



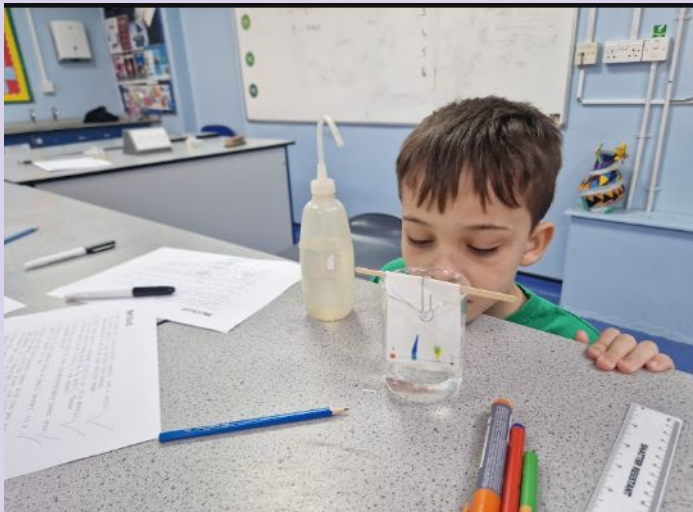
We saved the money and made some more bars and finally donated them to Ealing Soup Kitchen, for the homeless!

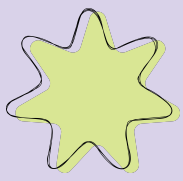
We started off Summer Term with our royal write. Year 5 have been loving using this time to be creative and embed their writing skills within their independent pieces!

In PE we have been learning and improving our fundamental skills such as skipping and being able to improve our stamina in Athletics.

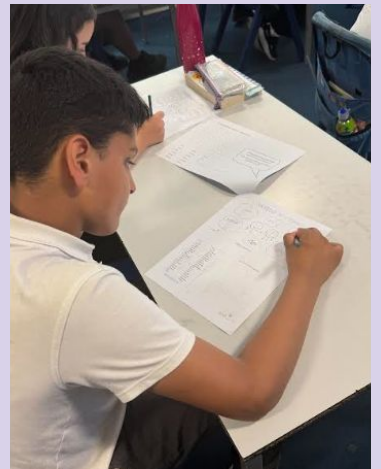
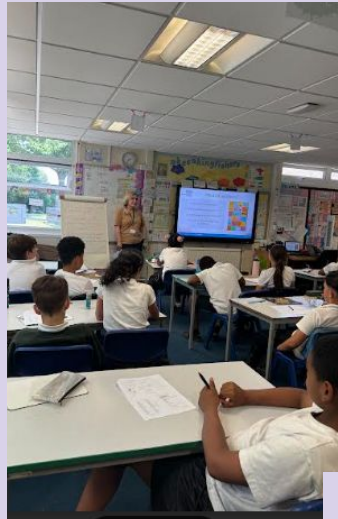


Year 5 *continued...*

Sports Day was full of competitive sports to compete it in! From basketball shots to egg and spoon races, we enjoyed it all!



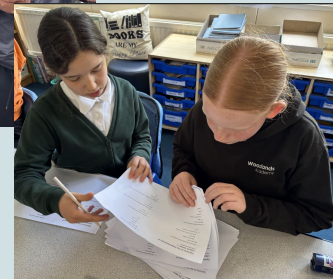
Year 6

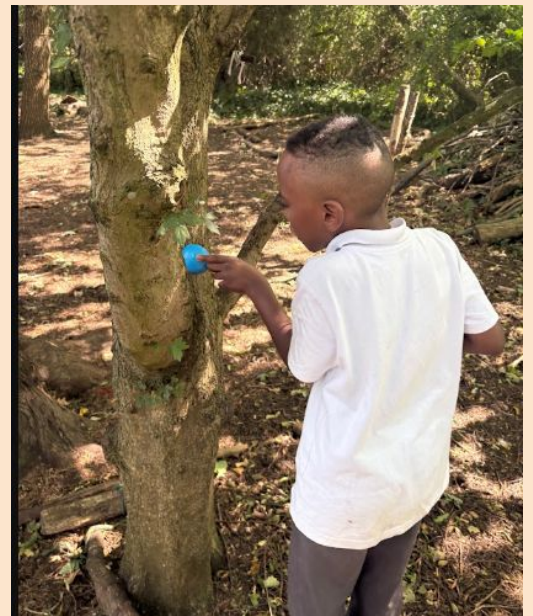

- **If you ever have concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child**, concerns can also be reported directly to ECIRS, which coordinates support from social care, health and police services to ensure children receive help quickly when needed. **Call- 020 8825 8000 or if a child is in immediate danger, report it to the police by calling 999.**
- **Please remember to ensure children are supervised at home and in public during the holidays.**
- Below is an important message we shared with children in our end of term assembly, reminding them about how to keep themselves safe while they are away from school. **Please discuss these messages with your children.**

REMEMBER:

1. Tell an adult if you are worried about anything online.
2. Be kind to others online. We can still monitor your school login activity. Take screenshot evidence of any inappropriate/ bullying behaviour then report the user and block them.
3. Keep your personal information private. E.g do not share photos or videos of yourself or anyone else. You never know who is watching!
